Project partners include the Sheriff's Office, District Attorney's Office, and Social Services from Storey and Lyon counties. Also includes the implementation of a new domestic violence shelter in rural Nevada.
  - *The Lyon County Family Enrichment Program*: A pilot program now in the second year of operation and a Juvenile Justice initiative that partners with Lyon County Juvenile Probation. Responsibilities include the supervision and oversight of mental health services provided to youth in the Juvenile Justice system, community outreach, and program development.
  - *The Storey County Safe School Professional Program*: Focused on the delivery of school based mental health and wellness services. Responsibilities include the supervision of mental health and substance abuse counselors in the elementary, middle, and high schools, community coordination, and curriculum development.
- Grant writing and management of multiple grants to support various initiatives and programs.
  - Mental Health Therapist specializing in grief, substance abuse, depression, anxiety, domestic violence, and other issues using individual, family, and group therapy sessions.
  - Domestic violence advocacy and support for primary and secondary victims of domestic violence
  - Supervising a clinical team that carries a case load in areas throughout Storey and Lyon counties comprised of master's level clinicians, drug and alcohol counselors, domestic violence advocates, and case managers.
